ORDER BY CONSENT – 07 July 2017

In the matter of Mr Anthony Clynes (43460)

Misconduct Mr Clynes' professional conduct was found to be in breach of the *Code of Professional Ethics* and to have posed a risk to the public or was likely to undermine public confidence in the Association or its members; namely:

1. On 24 June 2016, whilst a licenced member of AAT, Mr Clynes received a Disqualification Order for a period of six years at Manchester County Court in connection with his conduct as a Director of 24/7 Security Services (UK) Ltd

Finding Grounds for disciplinary action existed and the matter was suitable for exercise of the Investigations Team's powers under paragraphs 6 and 31 of the *Disciplinary Regulations*.

Order Mr Clynes is hereby:

1. Expelled from AAT membership until:
 - 1.1 the expiry of his disqualification on 24 June 2022; or
 - 1.2 he has satisfied his personal and/or company debt to HMRC:

Consent Mr Clynes agreed to submit to the decision of the Investigations Team in accordance with paragraphs 6 and 31 of the *Disciplinary Regulations*.
