ORDER OF AAT

In the matter of

Mrs Agnieszka Lisinska (20057449)

Misconduct

Agnieszka Lisinska's professional or personal conduct, was found to be in breach of the *Code of Professional Ethics* and to have posed a risk to the public or was likely to undermine public confidence in the Association or its members; namely:

1. On or around 01 June 2017, before the Norwich Crown Court, Mrs Lisinska was convicted on indictment of:
 - i. dishonestly making false representation to make gain for self/another or to cause loss to other/expose other to risk x2, and
 - ii. theft by employee x 3
2. Mrs Lisinska failed to disclose her criminal conviction to AAT within 30 days of the date of the conviction.

Finding

Grounds for disciplinary action existed and the matter was suitable for exercise of the Investigations Team's powers under paragraphs 6 and 31 of the *Disciplinary Regulations*.

Order

- i. Mrs Lisinska's student membership is withdrawn indefinitely
- ii. Mrs Lisinska is declared unfit to become a full member indefinitely

Consent

Agnieszka Lisinska is deemed to have consented to the decision of the Investigations Team, in accordance with paragraphs 6 and 31 of the *Disciplinary Regulations*.
