ORDER BY CONSENT

In the matter of

Claire Thurston MAAT (7993872)

Misconduct

Claire Thurston's professional or personal conduct was found to be in breach of the *Code of Professional Ethics* and to have posed a risk to the public or was likely to undermine public confidence in the Association or its members; namely:

- Between on or around April 2013 and on or around 18 September 2017, she provided self-employed accountancy or related services to the public whilst not registered or licensed, or approved to provide such services whilst subject to an exemption.
- Between on or around April 2013 and on or around 18 September 2017, she provided self-employed accountancy or related services to the public without being registered with a supervisory authority for the purposes of Anti Money Laundering.

Finding

Grounds for disciplinary action existed and the matter was suitable for exercise of the Investigations Team's powers under the *Disciplinary Regulations*.

Order

Claire Thurston is hereby:

- Reprimanded. The reprimand will remain live on Mrs Thurston's file for a period of 24 months
- Warned that she must become thoroughly acquainted and comply with relevant laws and regulations that govern her membership status with AAT.
- iii. Fined £436.00.

Consent

Claire Thurston has been deemed to have agreed to submit to the decision of the Investigations Team in accordance with Regulation 6 of the *Disciplinary Regulations*.
