ORDER BY CONSENT

In the matter of Graham Lever FMAAT, 6235354

Misconduct Graham Lever's conduct was found to be in breach of the *Code of Professional Ethics* and to have posed a risk to the public and/or undermine public confidence in the Association and its members as follows:

1. On 09 January 2015, Graham Lever was convicted of an indictable offence whilst registered as an AAT member.
2. Graham Lever acted contrary to AAT's *Disciplinary Regulations* in force in that he failed to notify the Association of his criminal conviction.

Finding Grounds for disciplinary action existed and the matter was suitable for the exercise of the Investigations Team's powers under the *Disciplinary Regulations*.

Order Graham Lever is hereby:

1. Divested of his fellow member status
2. Expelled from membership for a period of five years
3. Warned that any application to reinstate his membership, after expiry of the expulsion period, will be subject to a suitability assessment.

Consent Graham Lever consented to the decision of the Investigations Team in accordance with Regulation 6 of the *Disciplinary Regulations*.
