ORDER OF AAT

In the matter of

Mary Dunball (10095162)

Misconduct

Mary Dunball's professional or personal conduct, was found to be in breach of the *Code of Professional Ethics* and to have posed a risk to the public or was likely to undermine public confidence in the Association or its members; namely:

- Between on or around 22 November 2012 and 04 October 2016, Ms Dunball provided accountancy services and/or taxation and/or related consultancy services to the public as Dunballs & Co Ltd whilst not registered or licensed on the scheme for members in practice, or approved to provide such services whilst subject to an exemption.
- Between on or around 22 November 2012 and 28 January 2016, Ms Dunball provided accountancy services and/or taxation and/or related consultancy services to the public as Dunballs & Co Ltd without Professional Indemnity Insurance.
- Between on or around 22 November 2012 and 04 October 2016, Ms Dunball provided accountancy services and/or taxation and/or related consultancy services to the public without being registered with a supervisory authority within the meaning of the *Money Laundering Regulations 2007*.

Finding

Grounds for disciplinary action existed and the matter was suitable for exercise of the Investigations Team's powers under paragraphs 6 and 31 of the *Disciplinary Regulations*.

Order

Mary Dunball is hereby:

- i. reprimanded
- ii. warned over her future conduct
- iii. fined £987

Consent

Mary Dunball agreed the decision of the Investigations Team, in accordance with paragraphs 6 and 31 of the *Disciplinary Regulations*.
